up.



This is a group that is for members of our club to share information on photo locations, bird sightings, wildflower locations, fall colors or any other photo opportunity.








The loud clang of a steel hoe on the gravel driveway rang out as clear as a bell. I flew out the back door, down the steps and thru the pasture to my neighbor's fence. I said "mam, do you know you have a nesting Killdeer about ten feet from where you are working? I explained that Killdeers nest on the ground often in gravel driveways just like hers. She saw the female Killdeer flopping on the ground, trying to lead her away, and promised not to disturb the bird any longer. This is how my study of making videos with a DSLR started.

About 20 days later the nesting bird disappeared and Shirley and I started glassing the barren grasslands around the area wondering what happened to the nesting bird. Two days later we both spotted the bird with four small fuzz balls running around like marbles at her feet. Soon after we spotted the male who took up guard duty near our Weeping Willow tree where the chicks had found the 8x10 mud hole and the trickle of water from the hose I had placed some days before. In preparation for this event I had mowed the pasture, painted some of the rocks sticking up a bright white,(that attracts Killdeers) placed the slowly running hose above the tree and hoped my wild nature models would move over to our place where they were surely welcome.

My photographic plan was to take stills with my D-7000 and the 80-400 lens. The more I looked thru the viewfinder at the antics of this mob of kids with their Mom and Dad on guard, day after day, I realized this was a video gig, not a dull series of snapshots of little tiny birds with long legs driving their parents crazy as they scampered and dove in my mud puddle, with Mom and Dad trying to save their little bodies from every Jay Bird, Crow or Hawk that came by to take a look to see what the commotion was all about. I just had to get out the manual and learn how to take videos. But I did not even know how to turn on Live View, much less set the Focus Mode, Choose an AF-area mode, adjust five other settings and try to learn how to pan and follow this circus while squinting at the LCD screen and looking thru my binoculars almost at the same time. Well I did all of that and have a couple of videos clips I want you to see. Somehow I will figure how to post them to our Google website but right now they are too big to do that. Stay tuned.




