I recently spent a couple of weeks in England/Scotland with a group. I further realized that my old bones aren't what they used to be in trying get around. I took a camera bag with two DSLR's, two lenses on the camera, two extra lenses, spare batteries, extra cards, filters, cleaning supplies, you know.. all the things we know we need for successful photos. It's that 15lb camera bag we all hate to lug around. A few minutes on the shoulder & we know the pain. I also had a Canon S-100 pocket sized camera.

The reality was that when it got to be time to get off the bus to see the sights the bag stayed on the bus, I went out with one DSLR & one lens around my neck, the Point & Shoot camera in my pocket. 
EQUIPMENT FOR SALE

Eastern Sierra Photo Excursion

It felt like the dead of night. The wake-up alarm trilled in the dark telling us it was time. I rolled over listening as the motel room door banged within its frame from the waves of wind that bashed against it. Crawling from bed, I made my way to the window for a look. Wind, rain and snow told a sad tale. There would be no sunrise shots today.

Later, Judy Hooper, Ardath Winterowd and I sat in the only restaurant open in Lee Vining and nursed breakfast. A light snow blew sideways past Nicely's windows. The storm seemed to be hanging on the mountain ridges, staying mostly to the west of us. The sky to the east looked promising. Plans were made. We would start at Mono Lake's south tufas and then head for the June Lake Loop.

Our Eastern Sierra trip was much changed from the one planned. We were down to three after several other photographers had to change dates or cancel. However, we three ladies persevered.

After a great breakfast at Sweet Peas in Auburn, we headed out for adventure. Most of the trees along the Walker River had changed to a brilliant golden yellow and they beckoned us to stop, which of course we did. Later, just south of Bridgeport, the aspens caused us to catch our breaths. We pulled to the side of the highway for our first shots of those beautiful trees.

Down the highway a bit, we turned onto Virginia Lakes Road for a close encounter with a grove. Never having been that close to the trunks with a camera in hand, I tried for some of those great through-the-trunks photos I've seen from other photographers. The evening was approaching, so we headed on to check into Murphys Motel in Lee Vining.

The first major Sierra storm hit during our first night. The wind never ceased. We had to hold our tripods to have a chance at a solid shot. The rain and snow forced us to flee from site to site over the next two days.

However, we were there for photos and were determined to get them. Although the light was not great, the tufas at Mono Lake were. The snow-covered mountains to the west made quite a backdrop. The June Lake Loop abounded with scenic shots. Some of the higher groves had already lost their leaves, but the remaining aspens were plentiful and were turning from yellow to gold - a wondrous sight to behold. Even inside the storm, Lundy Lake Road was so lovely that we returned the next day when conditions were somewhat better.

Unfortunately, the storm kept us from visiting Bodie. I guess we weren't so adventurous after all.




