"SEE YOU THERE"

Since this is a print month if you're having trouble finding a printing lab I recommend Cali Color, 191 Lathrop Way Suite H, Sacramento, CA 95815. phone (916) 923-5505. www.calicolor.com They've been in business for many years, in the slide days I used to get my slides developed there, now they're a digital lab. The owner Patrick Kane and his assistant Holly Owen also know their stuff, I've dealt with both of them over the years.

Checkout their website, there is a way to submit your files digitally if you want to save a 35 mile trip to Sacramento for drop off. I prefer to bring my files in and preview them on their monitors before printing.

The prices are reasonable, I don't stick to a fixed proportion so my prints are priced by the area rather than a nominal paper size. A batch of recent prints with a 3/4" white border and a 18.5" long side (a 20" piece of paper) ranged from \$13.00 to \$22.80, most in the \$15-17.00 range. At other labs I'd have to crop to 16x20 or get charged for a 16x20 print regardless of the actual print size. Prices are on the website, there is a quantity discount.

They also scan slides if you have an old favorite you want to print.

Depending on the size of your order it may take a few business days to get it done so allow some time for them to do their magic.












ANOTHER QUICK TRIP TO THE HILLS

Another quick trip to the hills. This time I went, with Karen, to the hills south of Alta. The road is called, Lovers Leap, At the end of the road, it drops straight off into the American River Canyon. The road is pretty rough the last few hundred yards. We walked. There is still some color in the trees. On the way we found a fence made up of old bicycles.

A Photo That's Wild

Shirley and I are back hunting the Burrowing Owls and White-tailed Kites in the grass lands near Sheridan California. Within minutes, she spots an owl "with it's head on backwards" as she describes this cute little owl. While she is shooting the owl I am glassing the vast grass lands rising up to a hill in the west. That is where I spotted the "coyote". We shift our camera's lenses to cover the canine and I remark that it is the darkest coyote I have ever seen. It is hunting like a coyote does, it does have the long nose and head but there is something different. The coyote has spotted our jeep. Even though he is at least 1/8 of a mile away, he has spotted our stopped jeep, and he is watching us. I zoom the Tamron out to 600mm and fire away. It is a stand –off for a while, he is watching us, and we are watching him. And then he moves on. He is still hunting. With his nose to the ground, working back and forth, just like a coyote hunts.

I push the plus button on the back of the D-500 a couple of times to enlarge the picture, and something is not right. It's the color. There appears to be a white spot on his throat. Shirley calls out about a low flying White-tailed kite zooming in to us, and we get back to our task of trying to get that great flying shot of a White-tailed Kite.

When we got home I am panning thru our raw photos, when I come to the coyote pictures. I blow them up and almost fall out of my chair. What the heck is this strange looking "coyote". Take a look at these two pictures, one not zoomed and the other zoomed a lot. What do you think?

The next step is to go to nearby ranches and talk to people who live nearby. I will show them my pictures and see if someone has a dog that looks like this. If I cannot find someone who owns this critter maybe we have a highbred. A dog-coyote, wolf-coyote, wolf-dog, or just what we do not know. After completing my investigation with the neighbors, maybe I will confer with Fish and Wildlife. I will keep you posted.
