#### Home Grown Solar Eclipse Photography

This is a short summary of the "Solar Eclipse 2017" presentation given at the September 2017 meeting. This process will work well in both partial and full eclipse situations.

Cost was a major factor. Good Luck on your Next Eclipse

**Equipment Configuration:** 

Camera: Nikon D750 with Tamron 150-600 Telephoto

Lens (minimum 300 mm recommended)

**Solar Filter** (by Thousand Oaks Optical and others)

mounted on Lens between 2 UV Filters

Aiming Eyepiece – 1 inch diameter tube mounted on

Lens Hood

#### **Basic Photo parameters:**

Manual Mode with Auto ISO and AF off. Aperture f8. ISO 800

Exposure 1/125 sec to 1/8000 sec in a 7 Step Bracket at 1 F-stop per step

Selected Shutter speed in photos shown here is 1/1000 sec

QC mode with remote push button shutter control Pro Master GH25K gimbal mount on a Vanguard Alta Series tripod

General comments and recommendations: Tripod and gimbal mount should be able to support heavy camera and telephoto lens.

Plan to operate camera in LiveView mode to minimize risk of optical damage using eyepiece.

Assure that filter on front of lens is absolutely light-tight to avoid optical leakage, distortion, etc.

Take a bracketed range of 5 or more Ev steps to assure good photography during entire partial and full eclipse period.

Practice setup ahead of the event. There are no re-takes possible with planetary events.

### **Photographing Old Donner Pass**

Old Donner Pass as seen by travelling on old highway 40, thru Soda Springs, over the Rainbow Bridge and down to Donner Lake, is hard to beat for great photography. We photograph it in both summer and winter. We photograph the old buildings, rock climbers, railroad, ski areas, bridges, scenic mountains and of course in the fall, fall colors from the Willows, Aspens and lichens. Lake Van Norden, down in the valley south of Norden is now mostly a meadow since the dam was breached by PG&E, but still provides aquatic plant, animal and bird life along the creek in the summer. This very large high-mountain meadow now provides easy hiking to photograph wildflowers and birds, especially in the springtime. It is a very historic meadow since the early pioneers always camped there after their terrible struggle from Donner Lake over the pass. Maybe you can find an old oxen shoe there like I did many years ago.

Take I80 east from Auburn and turn off on the Soda Springs off-ramp and look for photo opportunities all the way to the Donner Lake boat ramp. There is great photo shooting along Donner Lake, especially in the winter with heavy snow, and earlier for fall colors. Use care in driving down the pass, high speed bikes often come barreling around the curves! The hazards are worth it and we think you will find a great photo experience.









### California Dept of Fish and Wildlife Lands Pass Expansion

The CDFW Lands Pass program has been expanded this year. It includes Gray Lodge Wildlife Refuge and the Woodbridge Ecological Reserve (Isenberg Crane Reserve) in November 2017. After January 2018 it's expanded to the Yolo Bypass Wildlife Refuge and North Table Mountain. The passes are per individual person, not per vehicle and are available on-line or at Hunting & Fishing License agents. Possession of a valid Hunting or Fishing License meets the requirement of having the Lands Pass.

The passes are \$25 a year and are for the calendar year. If you buy one in 2017 you'll need another in January for 2018. I'm going to pay the daily \$4.00 fee until January when I'll get the annual pass for 2018. More info & links at the below link.

#### The Birds Are In the Refuges

A November 7, 2017 trip to Gray Lodge Wildlife Refuge found a large number of geese in the ponds. The ponds by parking lot #14 (restrooms & kiosk) and along the auto tour route contained a large population of geese. Gray Lodge says millions of geese visit every year. I haven't checked on Colusa or Sacramento Wildlife Refuges, but if they're at Gray Lodge they should also be in those refuges.

There's a fee of \$4.00 per person per day payable at parking lot #14. Look for the envelopes and the

collection pipe at the kiosk.

Hope this works out to be a good bird year, it's a good start.


